Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE & QCIA)

- 20 Points from school Subjects
- Completed Core x 12 points – Complete all 4 units in a subject successfully = 4 points, Cert II completion = 4 points
- Literacy and Numeracy – pass a unit in Maths or English
- Students must have completed the Academic Integrity Course through their student account in QCAA. Completion can be seen on their TrackEd profile
- Students are tracked after each reporting period and on completion of Units
- QCIA – students are working on individual goals as set by their Learning Connections teacher.



Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE & QCIA)

- Results released on Wednesday December 16
- Results release via myQCE student portal on QCAA website
- This is the only way to access results for the QCE, QCIA and subject results
- Students will be able to access and download their Certificate and Senior Statement



Assessment Schedule 2026

- Proposed assessment dates have now been set
- Students and Parents have been emailed the proposed dates
- Changes may occur to due dates as they year proceeds
- Students will be given fair notice of any change of date particularly if the date is moved forward



Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments - AARAs

- An AARA is required anytime a student requires an extension to the due date of assessment and/or a change of the access arrangements of the assessment piece, for example additional time, resources, seating etc
- Students are responsible for applying for AARAs by submitting an AARA application and evidence to support the application.
- Medical evidence from a treating medical professional or GP must be current eg within 6 months of the application – The more specific the report is, outlining the adjustments required the greater the chance of success in approval. A confidential medical report template can be accessed through the QCAA website, or the school can supply one.



Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments - AARAs

- The school will then develop a school statement which will outline the history of adjustments that have been applied and the adjustments that we are able to support the student with. This will be signed of by the parents or carers prior to submission to QCAA
- AARAs for assessments are submitted to QCAA for approval. QCAA have final approval of all AARA's in year 12.
- A new submission may need to be made for External Assessments in term 4 - this is case specific and will be communicated by the QCAA.
- There is always no guarantee that QCAA will approve the applications.

Access arrangements and reasonable adjustments (AARA)

The QCAA requires a medical report for medical claims for AARA or illness and misadventure. Medical reports may be completed by the student's general practitioner (GP), medical specialist, or psychologist (registered under Queensland's *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act 2009*). 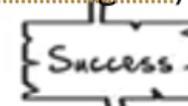

Interim Reporting

- Completed Week 6 of Term 1 and Term 3
- Reports will be emailed home
- **Academic progress reporting** communicates progress rather than achievement.
- On-balance progress judgements are based on a range of evidence to date. These may include diagnostic/ formative tasks (tests, quizzes); class activities (quick-writes; quizzes; worksheets); drafts and progress checks from assignment/ project work; anecdotal records from teachers (verbal quizzing, in-class discussions, feedback).
- These judgements are not summative results. Students, families and teachers will receive updated results via TrackEd after the unit of work's summative assessment is complete, as well as formal Semester reports twice a year.



Interim Progress Reports Academic, Effort and Behaviour Matrix



Students, parents and carers will receive an Interim Progress Report in Week Six of Term One and Term Three. This report communicates learning progress, effort and behaviour. The purpose of this report is to provide an early progress indication to parents and students prior to undertaking further assessment in their subjects.

On-balance progress judgements are based on a range of evidence to date. This may include diagnostic/ formative tasks (tests, quizzes); class activities (quick-writes; quizzes; worksheets); drafts and progress checks from assignment/ project work; anecdotal records from teachers (verbal quizzing, in-class discussions, feedback). Interim judgements are not summative results.

Students and families will receive updated results via TrackEd after the unit of work's summative assessment is complete as well as formal Semester or Unit reports twice a year. These reports are based on finalised summative assessment.

Ready to start your QTAC Application?

Before starting your QTAC application, it's important to be familiar with the following:

Create an account: Create an account with a personal email and a secure password. Only you can authorise a contact to access and support you in your QTAC Application experience.

Personal Information: Be ready to provide your personal details, educational background, and (if required) any relevant work experience.

Course Preferences: You can see courses inside the application portal. Decide on the courses you wish to apply for and arrange them in order of preference.

Documentation and Fees: Gather necessary documentation (some QTAC can obtain but others you will be required to supply (see Documentation) and be prepared to pay the application fee online prior to submitting your application.

Save your login details, as you'll need to access your application multiple times to complete, submit, adjust preferences, respond to alerts or offers, and ensure you're ready for the offer rounds when your preferred courses are available.

 **Ensure you use a personal email address:** Use an email address that you will have access to in the next few months (not a work, institution or school email address) when you sign up to the QTAC Application portal. This means you can easily help yourself regain access if you forget your password, you're in control of your password reset. You can only unlock your account by verifying your identity over the phone with QTAC.



An offer round is when eligible applicants receive offers from institutions. When you have participated in an offer round, you will learn the outcome of your participation and then need to take action and respond in a timely manner. You will need to respond to an offer before the final deadline, or if you didn't receive an offer, adjust your plan or preferences in preparation for the next offer round. There are many reasons you may not have received an offer.

QTAC conducts over 30 offer rounds throughout the admissions cycle, not including smaller daily rounds. Institutions choose how many rounds to participate in, with the two busiest rounds occurring at the end of the year and the beginning of the following year, during which most institutions make offers. Applicants can participate in multiple offer rounds, providing them with every opportunity to receive an offer for their preferred courses.

To Conditionally respond to an offer, please follow these steps:

1. Respond Outright: Choose one of the options above to respond to your offer.
2. Rearrange Preferences: Go to the Dashboard and adjust your preferences. Place the responded to offer in the lowest preference place and reorder any other courses according to your preference.
3. Confirm Changes: Click "Confirm Changes." The system will adjust your offer status to say your conditional response.

What Is TRP?

- The Resilience Project focuses on three simple, evidence-based pillars that help our students stay grounded and positive. We call them **GEM**:
- **Gratitude**: Noticing what we have, rather than what we don't.
- **Empathy**: Practicing kindness toward others, which actually releases 'feel-good' hormones in our own brains.
- **Mindfulness**: Finding ways to be present and calm in a world that is often very loud and very fast.
- In TEAM lessons, your children aren't just hearing about these concepts; they are practicing them through journaling, discussions, and activities. We aren't teaching them to avoid 'bad' feelings—we're giving them the toolkit to navigate them.

- Attend Open Day on 21st May – Pathway providers present
